24. Know that Northern Renaissance thinkers combined humanist ideas/techniques with Christianity.

25. Know that in More's Utopia, no one was lazy, there was no capital punishment, and everyone lived in harmony.

26. Know that Erasmus printed a vernacular version of the Bible.

27. Know that Michelangelo's David might be the best example of his focus on the human form.

28. Know that humanism focuses on human matters instead of religious or supernatural matters.

29. Vernacular is the term given to the local language of a given place.

30. Know that indulgences were sold by the Catholic Church to people to get them out of Purgatory or to erase their sins, and Martin Luther did not like them.

31. Know that Martin Luther's refusal to recant his Protestant ideas resulted in his excommunication.

32. Know that Ptolemy's ideas about Nature formed the basis of scientific thought before the Scientific Revolution.

33. Know that an informed, "educated" guess in science is called a hypothesis.

34. Know that Galileo confirmed and expanded upon the work done by Copernicus and Johan Kepler.

35. Know that part of the Counter-Reformation was the hunt for heretics called the Inquisition, which was especially bad in Spain.

36. Know that King Henry VIII created the Church of England so he could solve his marital problems.

37. Know that Sir Isaac Newton formulated the three Laws of Motion.

38. Know that Andreas Vesalius produced the first accurate, detailed book on human anatomy.

39. Know that the scientific method is a means of testing hypotheses.

40. Know that Galileo was nearly burned alive for supporting Copernicus' heliocentric model of the solar system.

41. Know that Rene Descarte summed up human existence with the thought, "I think, therefore I am."

42. Know that William Harvey was a pioneer of the human circulatory system.

43. Know that before Copernicus, science was based on the writings of Ptolemy.

44. Know that anticlericalism is summed up by opposition to clergy's immorality, ignorance, and pluralism.

45. Know that Martin Luther was studying to be a lawyer before he survived a lightning strike and became a monk.

46. Know that Holy Roman Emperor Charles V convened the Imperial Diet at Worms to hear Martin Luther defend his attacks on the Catholic Church.
